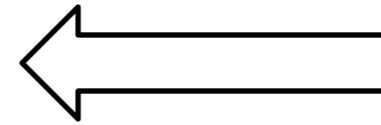

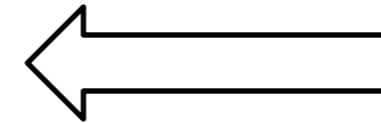


A Speech Is A Lot Like A Hamburger (Triple Decker)

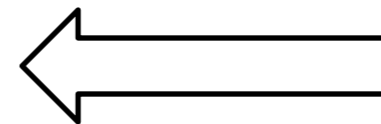

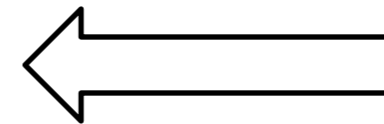

Go Shopping—Planning and Preparation



- Identify and know your topic clearly
- Choose something you know real well
- Choose something you are passionate about

Go Shopping—Planning and Preparation



- Choose a subject that appeals to your audience
 - Mind
 - Emotions
 - Senses
- Write down the conclusion you want to reach

Top Bun—Opening & The Hook



- Grab your audience's attention—The Hook
 - Open with a question
 - Startling statement
 - Fact that will catch your audience's attention
- Arouse your audience's interest with your opening statement
- Tell them the purpose of your speech
 - State your topic
- Let them know early the purpose of your speech



The Meat—Your 3 Points



- This is the meat of your presentation
- It contains support for your purpose
- Present your first key point and have your supporting information following-usually 2-3 supporting ideas under each key point

The Meat—Your 3 Points



- Do this with every point and you will not get lost. Just remember that you are working on the "meat (middle) of the hamburger."
- Include stories, personal experiences, examples and anecdotes when appropriate.
- Include facts, proof, or rebuttal of opposing views
- Do I need 3 points?



Bottom Bun—Conclusion

- Take a look at your opening again and here is where you will tie it in to the ending
- Ideally add a twist—everyone likes a twist
- Your audience will remember this
 - Make it a well-remembered ending
- Finish forcefully and confidently—that you know it and believe it
